

Piecing the Pineapple

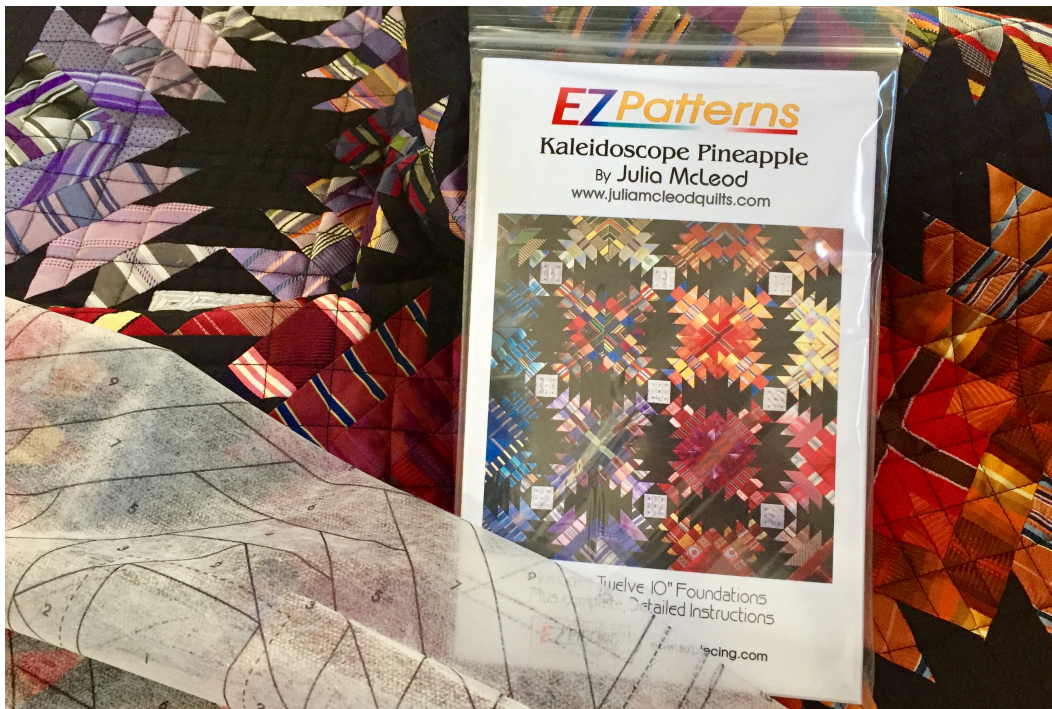
A fabric foundation piecing workshop with Julia McLeod

Piece the traditional Pineapple block using a uniquely lightweight, printed foundation made by EZ Piecing exclusively for my classes.

This light-as-a-feather product adds no extra weight or bulk to your blocks and is suited to working with all fabrics, especially silks and other fabrics that tend to slip and fray.

We'll discuss color choices and careful color placement through fussy cutting. Use your stash of neckties, saris, kimono and more, or take this class using regular quilters cottons.

Supply List

- This block can be completed using about one dozen neckties - 6 light, 6 dark. Other silks from scarves, furnishings and clothing are also suitable. Avoid super sheer silk chiffon. Quilters cottons also work well. You will need about 1/4 yard each of one light and one dark fabric - or make it scrappy. Bring plenty of fabric so you have choices. Expect to make one or two blocks in a day.
- Sewing machine, cord and pedal, bobbins
- Thread in a neutral color
- Scissors, thread snips and seam ripper
- Rotary cutter with a good blade
- Cutting mat and ruler
- Iron and ironing surface
- Pins
- Regular presser foot or walking foot.
- Notebook/Sketchbook and pen/pencil

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
